On March 2011, three disasters hit Fukushima: the eastern Japan great earthquake, tsunami, and the disaster at the nuclear plant. Ten months have passed and the disaster still continues. Before the 3.11.11 tragedy, there were more than 20,000 dogs and cats, 3,500 cows, 35,000 pigs and 440,000 chickens within 20km from the nuclear plant. Now most have already succumbed to starvation. However, we estimate about 1,000 cows, more than 1,000 cats and dogs are still waiting to be rescued. The goal of this exhibition is to promote awareness of the disaster and send messages to the local farmers in Fukushima. All pictures and video in the talk were taken in the exclusion zone by Dr Imamoto (the photo on this flyer is taken by Mr Hiroshi Hoshi while he was in the exclusion zone to rescue animals).
